The Transfiguration of Jesus – Luke 9: 28 – 36

Background: This chapter in Luke is considered the turning point in Jesus's ministry. He has been teaching, healing, and training the twelve to go out and do service (answer their call). Now, we get Jesus directly receiving His call from God as displayed in this passage. In a previous passage, Luke 4: 16-21, Jesus reads from the scrolls and proclaims that the prophecy is lived in him. He is rejected in Nazareth for this statement, but we see Jesus is beginning to reveal what He understands his mission to be. Recall how Jesus left his parents at age 12 to teach in the synagogue in Jerusalem and told Mary and Joseph he was doing this father's work.

In this passage, readers connect the Old Testament examples of Moses and Elijah, both whom went up to a mountain to pray and receive their mission. God made himself known to them in this way. Here, God is also letting himself be known to Peter, John and James. They are part of Jesus's new mission. They are witness to the call for Christ. More important, they are witness to God saying, "This is my Son, my Chosen, listen to him!" (Luke 9:35).

1. Where will they go to silently pray to God? What do you believe your response to God's call in your life?
